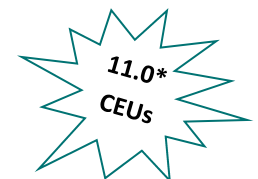

Dr. Patterson is a licensed Alcohol & Drug counselor in TN. Through NAADAC she holds certifications as a Master's Addiction Counselor and Qualified Substance Abuse Professional. She is also a NAADAC approved training provider. She is a Criminal Justice Addictions Specialist through NAFC and is a diplomat and board certified professional counselor with the American Psychotherapy Association (APA). She is certified in TN as a Clinical Supervisor and serves as a licensure oral examiner. She has worked as a counselor and program administrator for more than 26 years. She owns Footprints Consulting Services, LLC in Nashville where she provides client education, program consultation, professional training, and clinical supervision. She has conducted professional training for over 20 years on addictions, mental health and professional counseling issues. Dr. Patterson is a member of the Executive Advisory board for the APA and is NAADAC SE regional VP. In 2006 she received the Mel Schulstad award, NAADAC's Professional of the Year award.

Abstract

The Diagnostic Statistical Manual is the standard for diagnosing mental, personality and substance use disorders. Many changes were made from the DSM IV to the DSM 5. The release of the manual was expected but anticipated with anxiety and some fear. For addiction professionals, the changes were difficult as they included changes to the language commonly used in diagnosing substance disorders and redefining use, abuse and addiction to a continuum. Some additional diagnoses were added that will aid counselors in the treatment process with client. This seminar will explore changes in the DSM 5, using it affectively to diagnose substance use disorders, identifying symptoms of co-occurring mental disorders and working with clients with co-occurring personality disorders. Cultural considerations when diagnosing with also be discussed. Through didactic, multimedia and experiential methods, Dr. Patterson will guide participants through an educational and entertaining seminar.

Saturday



Ron Chupp has worked in Mental Health and Addictions since 1991. He received his Bachelor's degree in Social Work from Goshen College in 1993 and his Master's degree in Social Work from Indiana University in 2005. He was certified in addictions in 1998, and was licensed as a Clinical Social Worker in 2009 and as a Clinical Addictions Counselor in 2010. He works as a Mental Health and Addiction Counselor at Michiana Behavioral Health Center in Plymouth. Ron is a founding member and Past President of the Indiana Association for Addiction Professionals, and has chaired the IAAP Ethics and Bylaws Committees. He currently chairs the NAADAC Bylaws Committee and is a member of the Ethics Committee.

Abstract

Ron has conducted extensive research into the effects of trauma on the development of addictions from the very beginning of his career. Based on his research, Ron wrote an article for the IAAP newsletter entitled, "If We Are Not Treating Trauma, We Are Not Treating Addiction." His research has shown a very high correlation between childhood trauma and addiction, which has recently been confirmed by the Centers for Disease Control. He has successfully adapted trauma-specific treatment into his addiction treatment programs, which have been highly successful. This session will help Clinicians learn to identify trauma, the effects of trauma on the brain, and to incorporate trauma-specific treatment into their addiction treatment programs to increase successful outcomes for their clients.
