FRIDAY SPEAKER



Larry Ashley, Ed.S., LCADC, LMSW, LPC, CPGC, has been involved in the substance abuse and trauma field for thirty five years as a college professor, researcher, and therapist.

He is currently Addictions Specialist and Undergraduate Coordinator in the Department of Counselor Education at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, Director of the Problem Gambling Treatment Program, and Clinical Assistant Professor in the Departments of Psychiatry and Internal Medicine, University of Nevada School of Medicine. Due to his extensive clinical experience coupled with opportunities for local, national, and international speaking engagements, Professor Ashley is considered to be a leading expert on Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and issues related to addictions. He has a special interest on the impact of war on soldiers world wide.

SATURDAY SPEAKER



Dr. Gaither joined Valle Vista in January of 2003. James M. Gaither, M.D. practices Internal Medicine, Sleep Medicine and Addiction Medicine in Indianapolis, Indiana.

A graduate of the University of Notre Dame and Indiana University School of Medicine, he is Board Certified in Internal Medicine, Pulmonary Medicine, Sleep Medicine and Addiction Medicine and has practiced in the Indianapolis area since 1986. He currently specializes in Addiction Medicine, providing services to Fairbanks Hospital and Valle Vista Health System. He practices Sleep Medicine at Meridian Health Group, a multispecialty pain management practice. He serves on the Board of Directors of Progress House (Emeritus status) and is the past president of the Dove Recovery House for Women and of Esther's Place, a resource center for women entering recovery from drugs and alcohol. He is active in the Indiana Society of Addiction Medicine and he actively promotes awareness of the need for treatment of both sleep and addiction disorders, speaking on the national, state and local levels.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Trauma and Addiction: This workshop is designed to provide each attendee with a working knowledge of trauma and addictions in the workplace e.g. combat trauma, problem gambling and eating disorders. Emphasis will be placed on identifying signs and symptoms. The diagnostic criteria for various trauma categories and appropriate treatment approaches will be discussed.

TBI & Addictions: Chemical Dependence is considered a primary, chronic, neurobiological disease, with genetic, psychosocial and environmental factors contributing to its development. The complex interplay of the brain and the environment, determined by the genetically mapped anatomic and neurochemical foundation, and modified by formative experiences, responses to physical, emotional, psychological events in the course of life, lays the groundwork for the development of addictive disease. The impact of traumatic brain injury, its treatment, and its sequelae, immensely alters the equilibrium of the delicate homeostasis of drive, reward, emotion, impulsivity, and executive function; this often results in the development or unmasking of the disease of addiction. Many of the factors contributing to this altered homeostasis cannot be modified by the health care provider, others can. This presentation will address the underlying neurophysiology of addiction, the impact of traumatic brain injury, and some strategies that may be useful in the prevention, treatment, and management of addictive disease in the brain injury patient.
