Thomas Durham, PhD, LADC







FRIDAY

Advanced Group Skills: Using the Stages of Change Model and the Influence of the Group in Motivating Change

This one day workshop is a skill-based experiential training that explores the transtheoretical model of behavior change and its effective application in a group setting. This training will demonstrate how motivation to change can be influenced by the group itself with the goals of promoting self-acceptance, self-awareness, self-responsibility, and communication with others through experiential activities designed to engage members of the group.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Apply the transtheoretical model of behavior change in the group setting.
- 2. Demonstrate the effectiveness of motivational interviewing in the group setting.
- 3. Devise strategies for using the group process to facilitate change.
- Examine effective techniques in engaging group members.

SATURDAY

Integrating Treatment for Co-occurring Disorders: Myths, Realities and Effective Approaches to Care

This one day workshop is a skill-based training that focuses on understanding, referring, and treating individuals who have co-occurring disorders. This outlines the many myths related to mental illness treatment, barriers to effective care of co-occurring disorders, commonly encountered mental disorders, DSM-5 diagnostic criteria, applicable screening and assessment instruments and issues surrounding medication management and coordinating with other mental health professionals. This workshop will also introduce the integrated model of mental health and addiction treatment services, outlining how to utilize current substance abuse and mental health treatment best practices.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Identify common misperceptions and biases regarding co-occurring disorders.
- 2. Apply screening for the most frequent disorders that co-occurring with substance use disorders.
- 3. Integrate substance abuse and mental health referral services.
- 4. Translate information presented during the workshop to clients, families, colleagues and the community.
